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Keith Linder and his then-girlfriend thought they had found their perfect first home. It was in a nice area although one of the kids of their neighbours was crying so loud it sounded like it was right in the room with you. Property taxes were reasonable. And it was in a capacity. Maybe too much. The country house, just outside Seattle, had enough space to hide a legion of squatters who had no problem letting owners know they didn't like what they were watching on Netflix. According to *The Bothell Hell House: Poltergeist of Washington State*, which is out April 15, the house was anything but a sweet home for some of the most spiteful and cruel spirits in America. The house stirred up the underground paranormal community it attracted the attention of travel channels Ghost Adventure, which dedicated the entire contribution to the Demons in Seattle. But ghost hunter Zack Bagans and his team found no evidence of foul players. Of course, the Bagans didn't hear voices, didn't see the Grey Lady, or should have tried to call 911 a dozen times to report the fire. The ghosts Linder encountered after moving into the house in May 2012 were not Bible lovers. They burned three of Linder's collections. The spirits also had their own ideas about hanging plants, avoiding twine or hooks and suspending them in the air. Classified as a poltergeist, the organization threw beer bottles, bar stools and a butcher's knife while Linder was a witness. He also caught more than a glimpse of the phenomenon of an old mischievous lady. Linder called the Parapsychology Science Institute, which sent a team that created motion detectors and recording equipment. They caught the evidence. The house was driven out twice. Once their reluctant local church, and again the Episcopal priest Father Roy, who also expelled Kate, just to be sure. Keith called in paranormal researcher Don Phillips and British parapsychologist Steve Merah, who brought the best evidence. Most of this evidence is on display in the upcoming documentary *Demons in Seattle*. Linder moved out of the haunted house in 2016. He spoke exclusively, albeit quietly, with Den Geek about the horrors of homeownership. DEN OF GEEK: What possessed you to move into a house in the first place? KIT LINDER: It was my very first home. I was promoted to work wise and the decision made between me and my then girlfriend was let's move along. It was a beautiful house. A new house built in 2005. You had no fears, no foreboding? No, who felt the first stirring or otherness, you or your then-girlfriend Tina? We felt the first stirring together, baby cough day, when we got the keys to the house, and we saw the plant levitate a few weeks later, while watching Netflix. So you get the keys and you hear this bronchial spasm. What do you think it was? How did you first write it off? The homeowner had just left, my girlfriend and I sitting in the living room talking about etc. what room for what goes Then we hear the baby coughing, very distinct. We look at each other and ask: Was it a coughing baby? It sounded as if it came from one of the rooms upstairs. But we shrugged because we were home high. I wasn't even close to thinking of paranormal phenomena. We disavowed how to think that he had come from outside and did not give him a second thought. So you didn't think about it until the plant became potted? So, your first reaction to levitation, what was it and how long did it last before you could move forward? The plant rises straight up, rotates 360 degrees dropped. It happened in a matter of seconds. We came up, investigated and were, how did it just happen? We thought we had a punk or a prank since we were new to the neighborhood. So you were looking for strings? Yes. Wires, remote devices, etc. That's funny? Don't get mad. Kind of amused. Like, what's the fuck? How wow, has this just happened? Who's behind this? But not quite scary yet? Oh no, it's not scary yet. Was it a kind of giggle? It's more like a v, it's trippy. I can't believe we could have a ghost. We're back to coughing. We think a prankster is a ghost, a baby ghost who is lost or something. So, did you think ghost early on, what was the first thing that really scared you? Weeks later, when the doors started to slam, and loud claps. We thought maybe it's not as friendly as we thought. Each event forced us to reconsider our assumption. But you've never had a feeling Eddie Murphy is too bad that we should move? No, not at this stage. But you were scared of this moment, but you thought it was like bad roommates? That's a terrible word. More like he's got our attention now what? Where does that go? This is the question we are asking at this stage. Tina and I. It happens much later. We are still in the stage of getting to know with Poltergeist, all the preliminary stuff So ghosts ever make you laugh? It's not going to make us laugh. We laughed a few times at the situation in which we were like wow, is it real? Is this really happening? Things like that. Are we dreaming? Its surreal to see objects flying, objects floating, bangs, wall writings, etc. so what first made it real? What bought the point of the house that the house chased were flying plants and others and loud claps. And what finally scared you? For Tina in particular, the door slams while watching TV or while showering. For me, loud claps, throwing a bar stool and a gray ghost lady when I saw her turn off my office hall light. She hit the switch and started running. It made it real, super real. Having a face, a body to what we've all experienced. It happened about a month 3 or 4. How clear was the grey lady? How clear was your feeling for her? About like a day. Opaque, it was solid, standing a few feet away from me, full bodily. Any pictures of her ever coming out? No, but I got a video of the revamp when I saw it a second time. Now she's all white though. About how Was she? Was she even nice? Did she exert any ghostly charm at all or did she feel spiteful? We're talking about 2014. The first time was in the summer of 2012. When she reappeared, it was in 2014. She always looked tired, worn out, confused, mischievous, nasty. Small, hair up to her lower ear or shoulder, 5 feet 5 or 6. I tell people to imagine Carmen Diaz. That's how she looked, except for the more worn and tired. The same body type though and the length of the hair. Was she scared or how did she feel? What was it like? She felt lost, confused. The second time was like watching a movie play, recording or something. But to see, walk or interact with me, it was surreal. There was no eye strain, no translucent or see through the feeling. It was 100% solid. This is what made it scary to see something like a movie and interact only gone in no time. You can't help but think it would suck to get on her bad side. And maybe we've been before. And she never saw you? I have to assume she saw me, especially the first time. She turned off the lights with me in the room. The room was occupied and BAM, the light went bad, and it was right there. So when will this escalate to the point where you should have called the expert? Oh, we called people in 2012 and 2014, churches, paranormal teams, priests after the first fire. We tried to have the house blessed, tried to get the commands as soon as the violence started and the activity picked up. What was the first episode of violence? The fire on the poster was a major event in the spring of 2014. Tina just left for work. We smeared the house a lot the night before. I was in the shower when the alarm went off. I dart, dripping wet, towel wrapped around me and step in the hallway, the force zooms past me, I see the front door open/close to the landing area where I stand. There's no one there. Anxiety cries, smokes, filling the second floor. My brain thinks of an intruder, so I dart to the front door. I'll get there, and the door won't open. He won't budge as his cemented shut down. I run back upstairs and put out the fire, the poster, that is, run back, and realize again I'm under attack. The front door won't open as I try to let out the smoke. I'm calling 911. They can't understand me, every time I give my name and location, the phone breaks down. It takes about 3 to 4 tries for them to finally get me. Fire engines arrived a few minutes later. Tina's coming home because I called her. Everyone scratched their heads except me and Tina. No one can understand how the poster caught fire. Eventually they leave. Tina and I were emotionally beaten. I tremble like a wet puppy left in the cold all night. Tina finally blurs that we're going to the Catholic Church, and we're not leaving until they see us. It was my first real before Super Uber. Strength, something huge with density ran past me on the landing pad. The front door opened wide and closed, and the fire and door did not open. So what did the first experts tell you? Experts? The church told us evil spirits. The teams told us Poltergeist. Some said both. Shamans spoke evil spirits, demons. The parapsychological community said it was a poltergeist, an intelligent ghost. What finally made you decide to leave? Once our claims have been definitively substantiated and enough evidence has been gathered. I lost my girlfriend in the process. It's time to go. Four years was enough. The paranormal community knew that the house was real, as in haunted and activity showed signs of returning. These 3 things made it time to leave. I wanted to leave on my own terms, not perfume terms. So they just don't live with the undead? Exactly. They eventually win. They're undead. The activity will taper off, but it also comes back and each time is worse than before. I wouldn't have survived a third time. I know I wouldn't. So there's no way to make friends, no communication? Did you ever think it was evil? Oh yes. I knew it was evil. After the fire and after talking to the tenants in front of us, what happened to them years ago, plus our experience. It was right up to the evil. Evil. Do you miss her in spirit? Oh no! (laughs) I don't know what to do. I don't miss the spirits. I wouldn't ask the devil to live in this house. What do you think of other people who claim hauntings? Have you met the others? Living through something like this gave me a chance to learn the true sayers from skeptics. Many of them have found me online, shared their experiences from all over the world. The resemblance is shocking. It happens more than people realize, it's a terrible part about it. I was once 50/50 about paranormal activity. Now I'm 100% a team of paranormal phenomena, 200% actually. Does this have religious implications for you? Did that shake your faith? Can you confirm that? Is this completely unrelated? It shakes and confirms your faith for both of me at the same time. It shocked my faith in the church for help we didn't receive and shocked my faith in organized religion. At the same time, she affirmed my faith in life after death, about God, the Devil, evil and Good. Hell and paradise exist side by side, and I mean side by side, all around us. What do you say people refuse to believe? I'm not saying anything. They refuse to believe. They just refuse to believe. I almost wish they could test it themselves so they could believe it. But then I think to myself. That's not fair. Their faith can be a blessing. And do you think some people jump into the faith too fast? A few, yes. I have learned by those who believe me tend to consider me the cause of my own experiences or the experiences of someone they knew or knew. What is the most important determining factor? People based reality on their life experiences, on what they had already seen, what they are currently seeing and what they hope to live to see. That's how people define what's real. With some people, it's harder to believe others it's easy. It's all about susceptibility. It's how open we are to new things. I was 50/50 and boy I've seen a lot, experience a lot. I doubt I would have experienced this if I had 100% faith in the supernatural/paranormal. What I want the reader to get or understand from this book is it was written from the perspective of the occupants of the house. The book itself contains video, audio and images of evidence. It's never been done before in a book like this. Thus, the reader can pause (those that dare) and visit the links and URLs to see and hear the evidence themselves. Evidence, most of them comes from the researchers themselves, the ones who lived in the house. All in chronological order. There were no blows. Nothing softened and did not amount. It all happened. The reader will get that within seconds of reading the book. Are you free now that you've left the house? Some leftovers from Botell's house followed me to the new house. I call them henchmen. I did an experiment at my new location, a four-month experiment where I captured some of the pulsating, breathing and heartbeat from my mattress and bed pillow. This is the best science video on my YouTube channel. What the viewer sees and hears is what I have heard and felt for the last three years. The pulsation, the heartbeat, not mine. Not even a person as explained in the video. It deserves looks to see and debunk the evidence. We are talking about the state of modern medical equipment. There are other documented cases of heart rate, pulsating mattresses reported in both Geist and Demonic phenomena. This is the 1st 21st century audio and video evidence collected.
